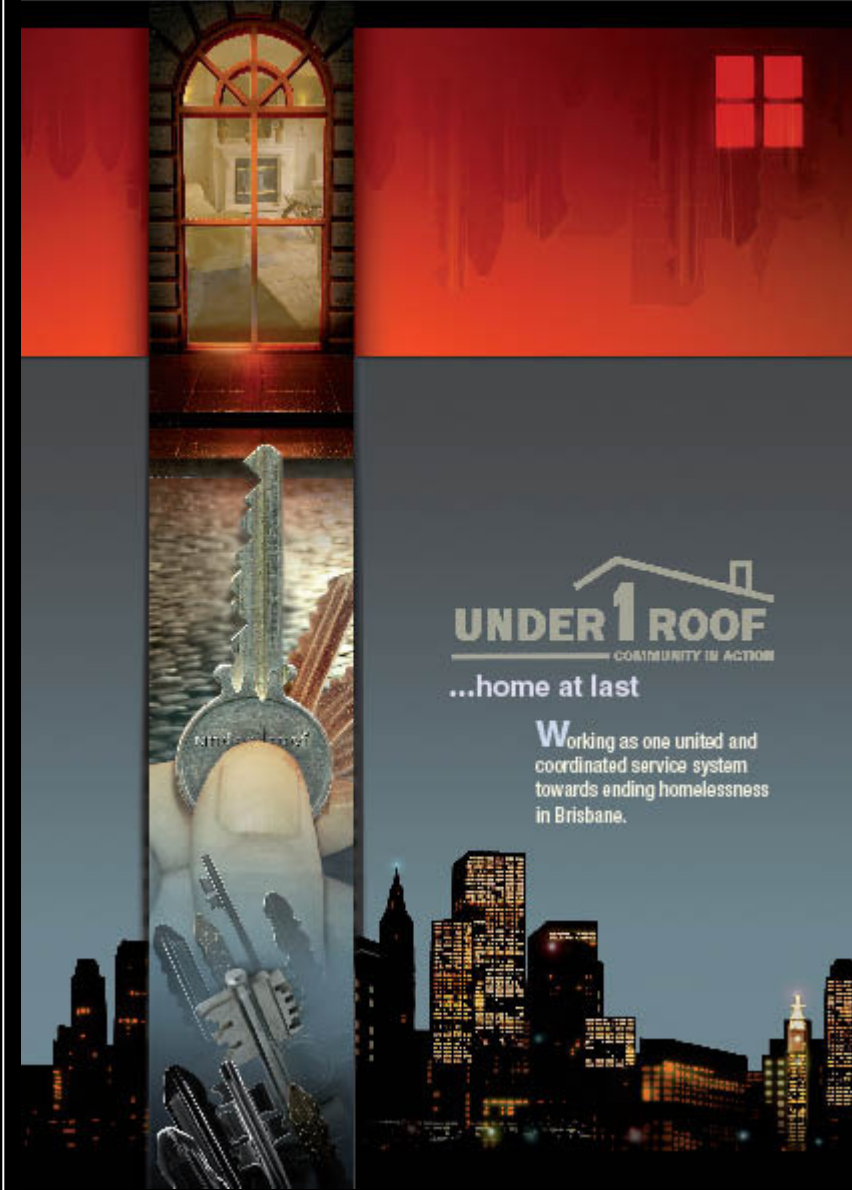

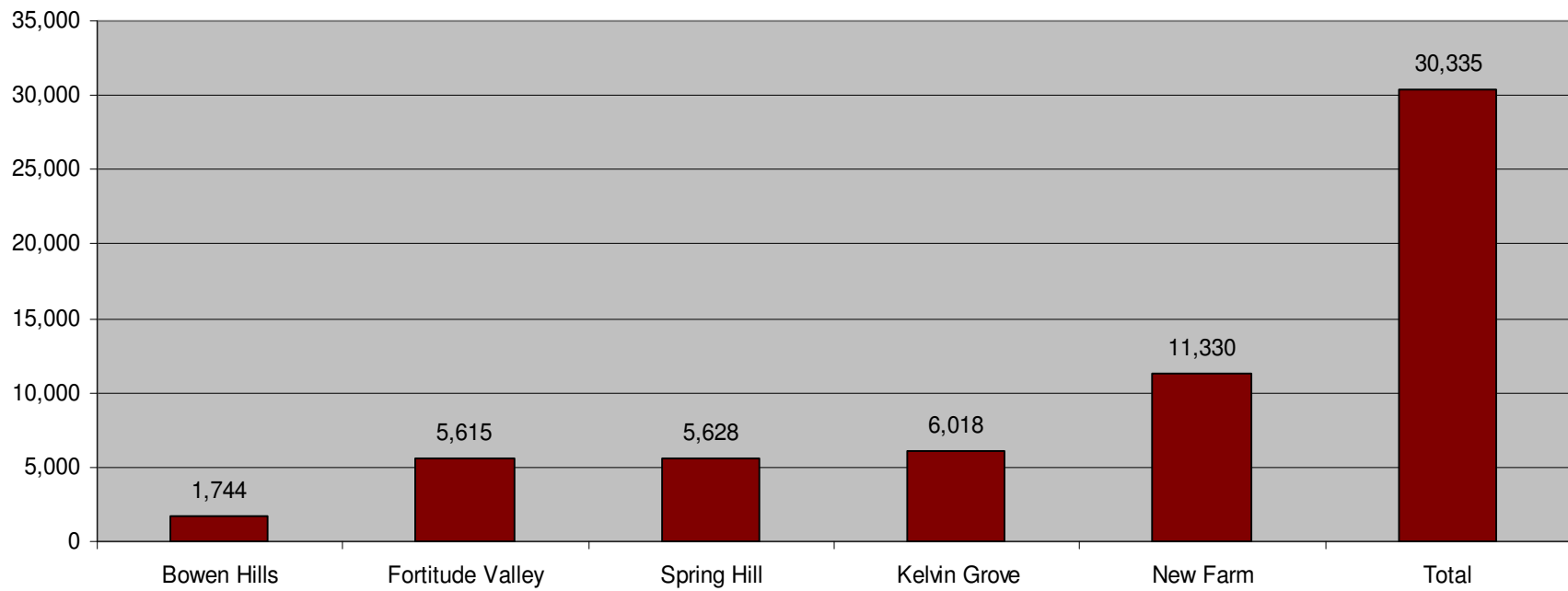

# Homelessness

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- Primary homeless: Sleeping rough” on the street
- Secondary homeless: Couch surfing, emergency shelters
- Tertiary homeless: Insecure, low standard accommodation such as boarding rooms

In the 2006 Census (the 2011 census has been conducted but not reported) Brisbane City was recorded as having a total of 2070 homeless people:

- Primary homeless: 288 (14%)
- Secondary homeless: 457 (22%)
- Tertiary homeless: 1325 (64%)

# Homelessness

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- There are 5395 homeless people in Brisbane City (2006)
- 38% of the city's total homeless are in an area with 9% of the total population
- In Brisbane, there are 670 homeless Indigenous People (over 30% of the State's Indigenous homeless, 32% of whom were in the inner city and 39% of these were sleeping rough)
- One night survey conducted as part of *50 Lives 50 Homes* profiled 249 individuals seen on the street and in emergency accommodation, courts, food vans and squats:
  - *68% identified as rough sleepers*
  - *51% with high mortality rates*
  - *Over 80% were on Disability Support Pensions*

# Homelessness in Brisbane

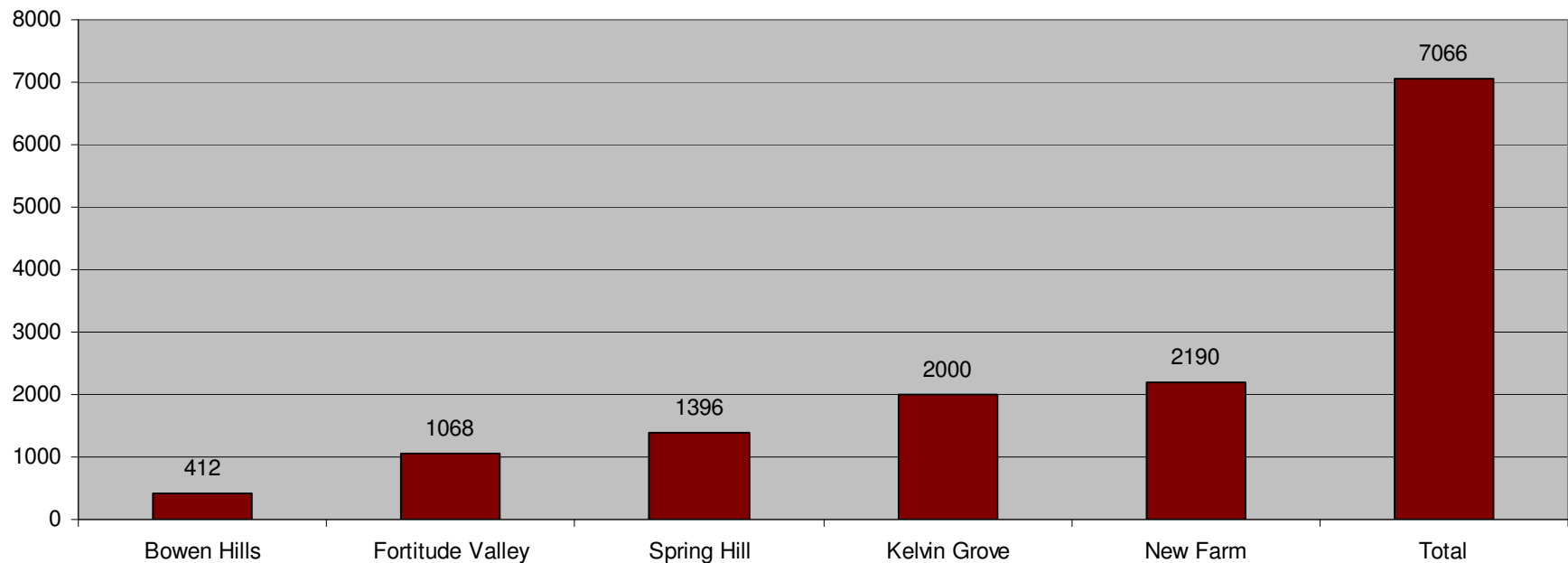

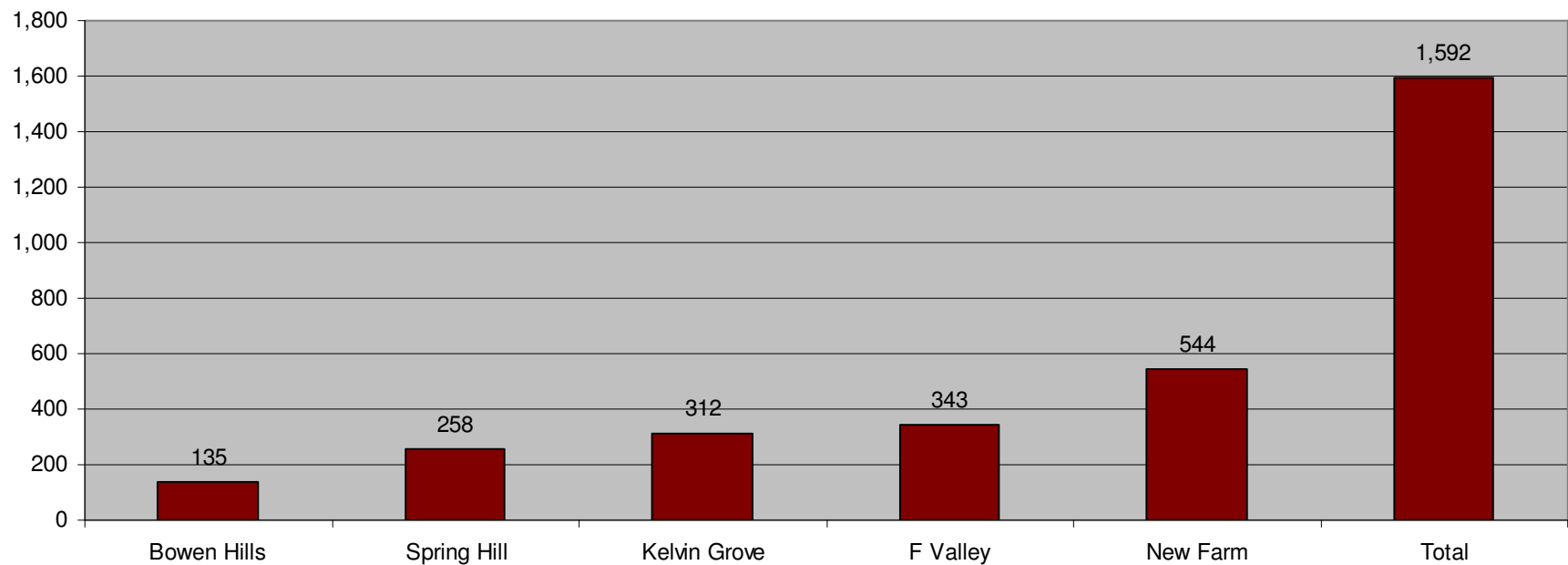
Number of individuals with income less than \$400 (2011)

Household income <\$400 per week (2011)

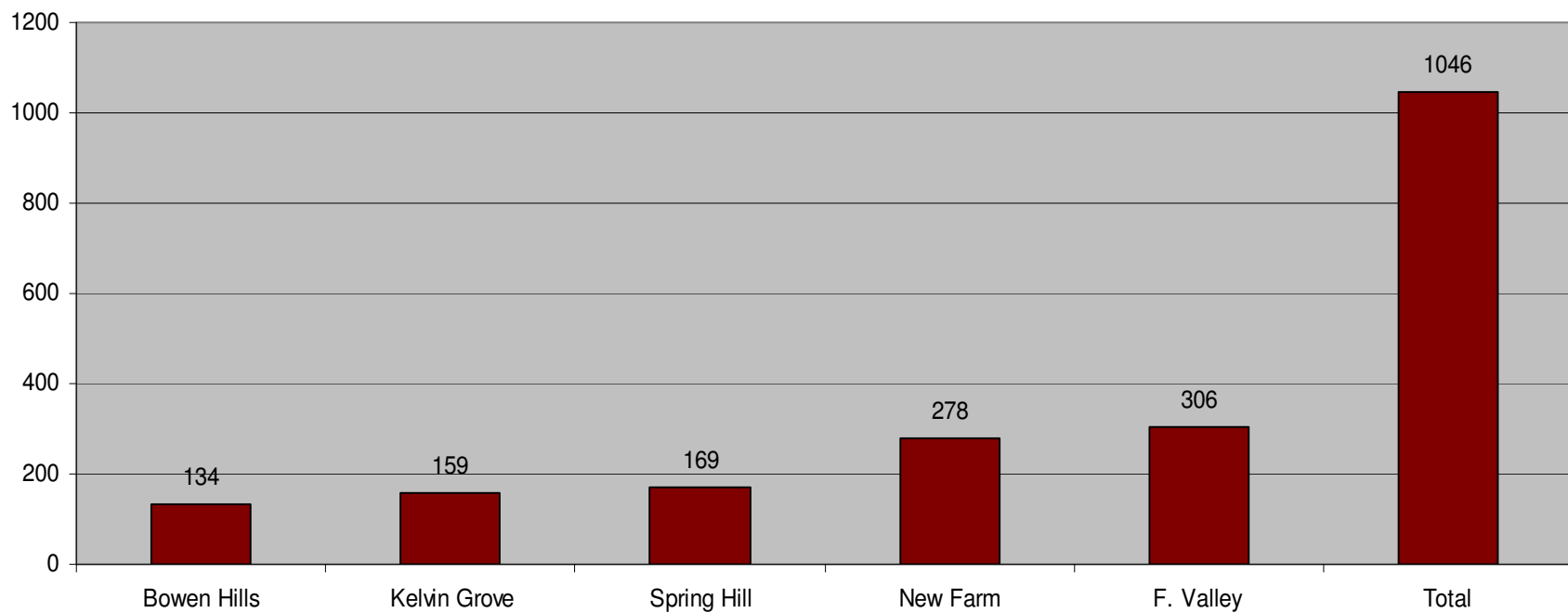

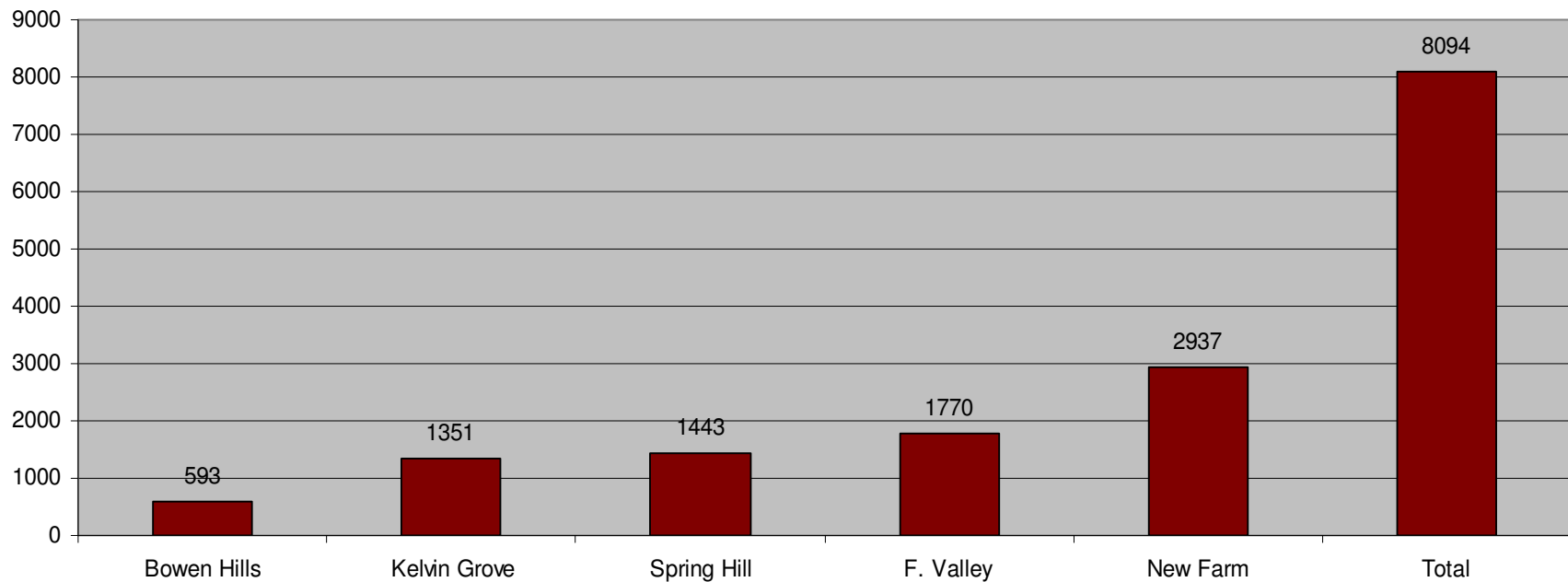
Tenure: rented from housing authority/church/community landlord (2011)

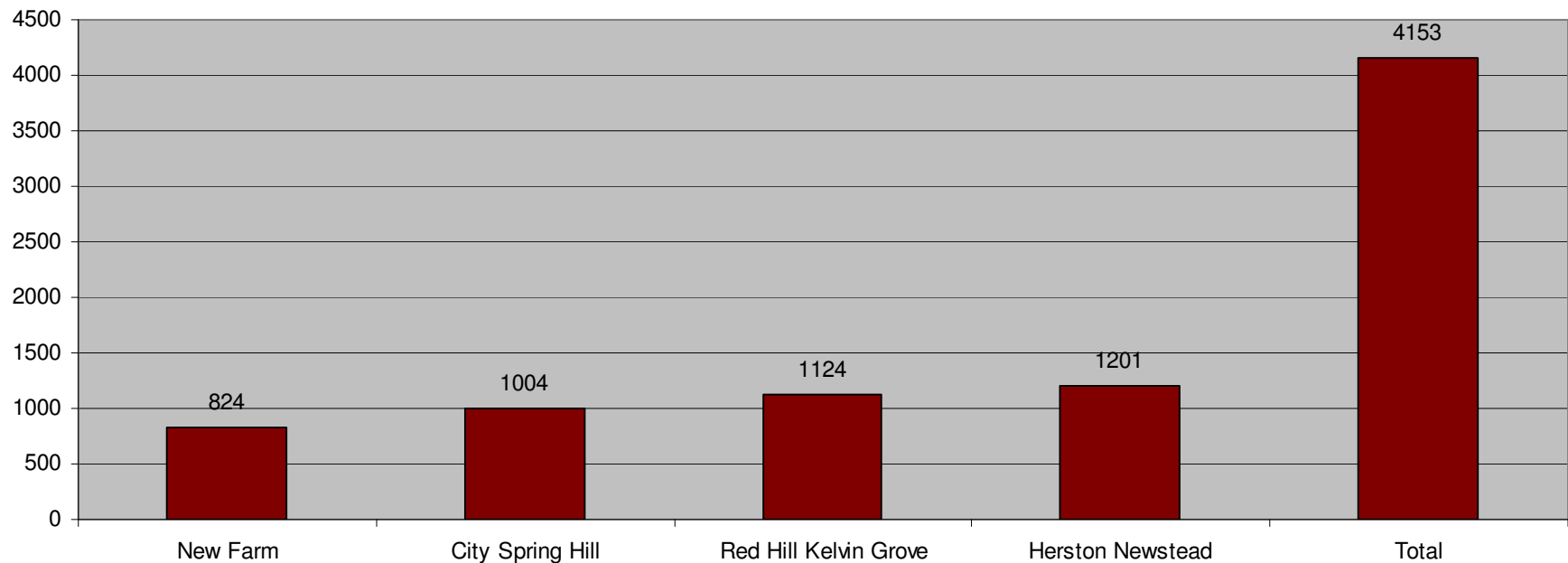
Tenure:renting (2011)

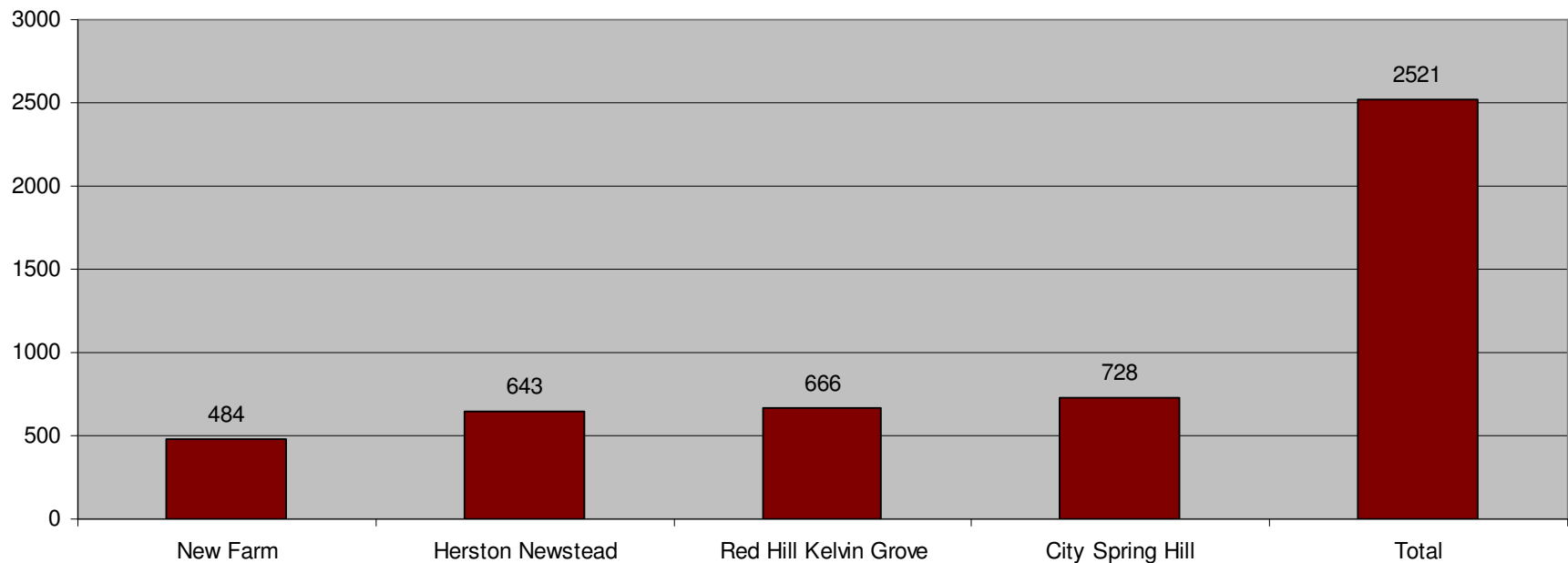
Households in receipt of rent assistance (2009)

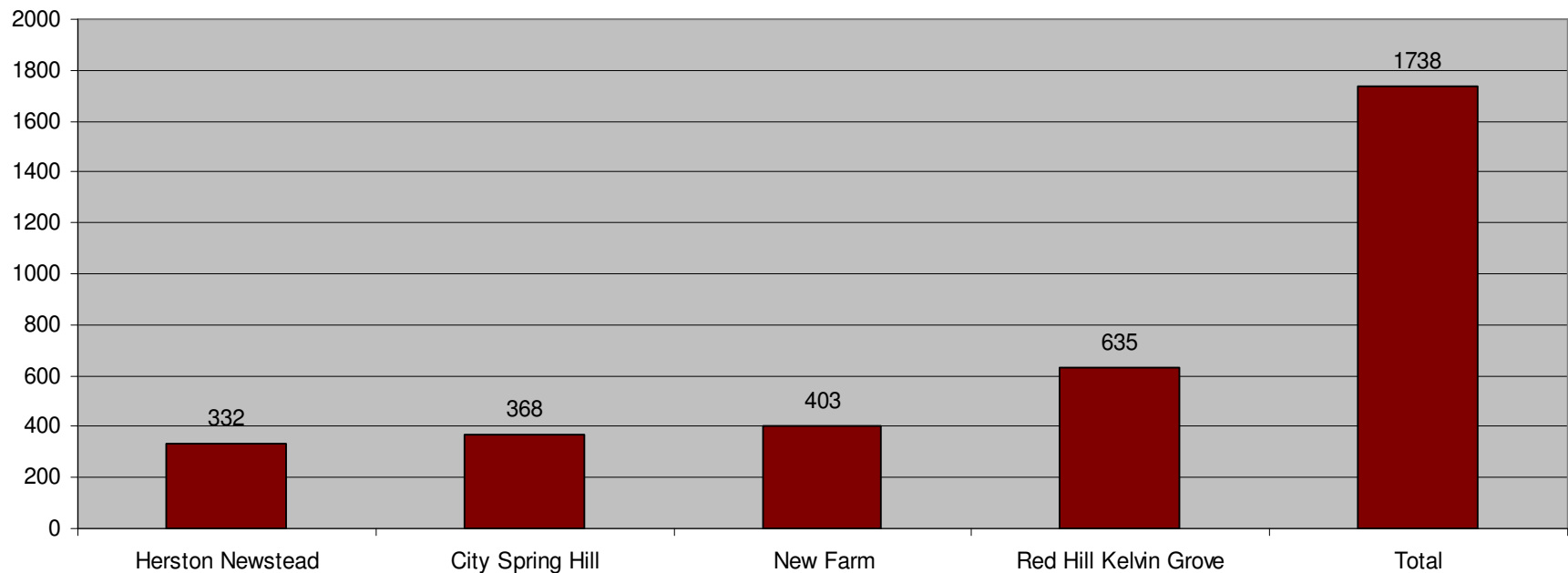
Number of health care card holders (2009)

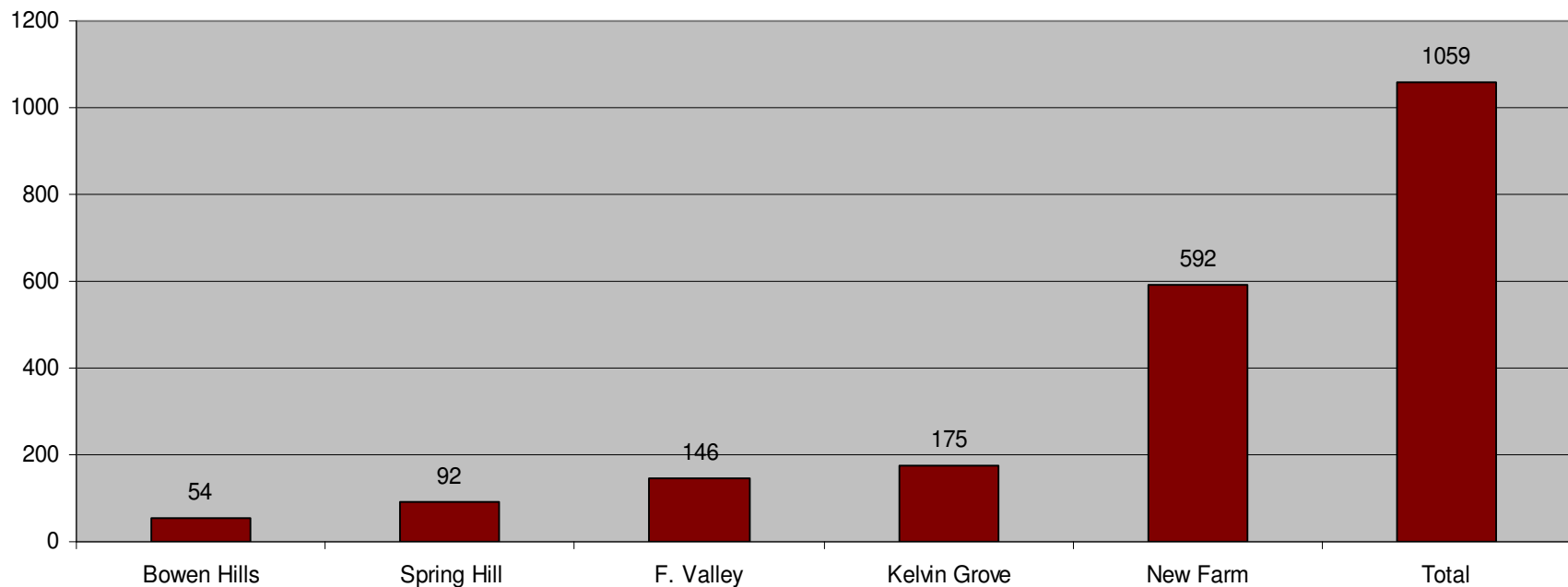
Disability support pension (2009)

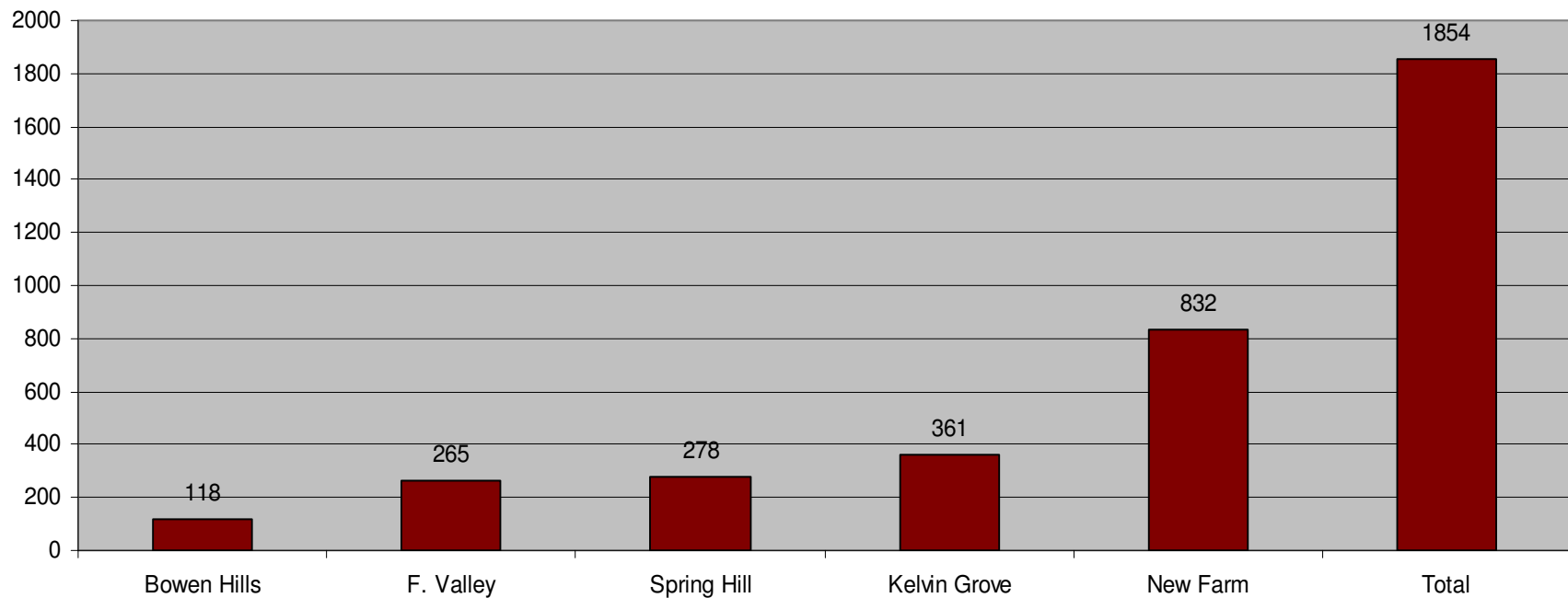
Need for assistance with core activities (2011)

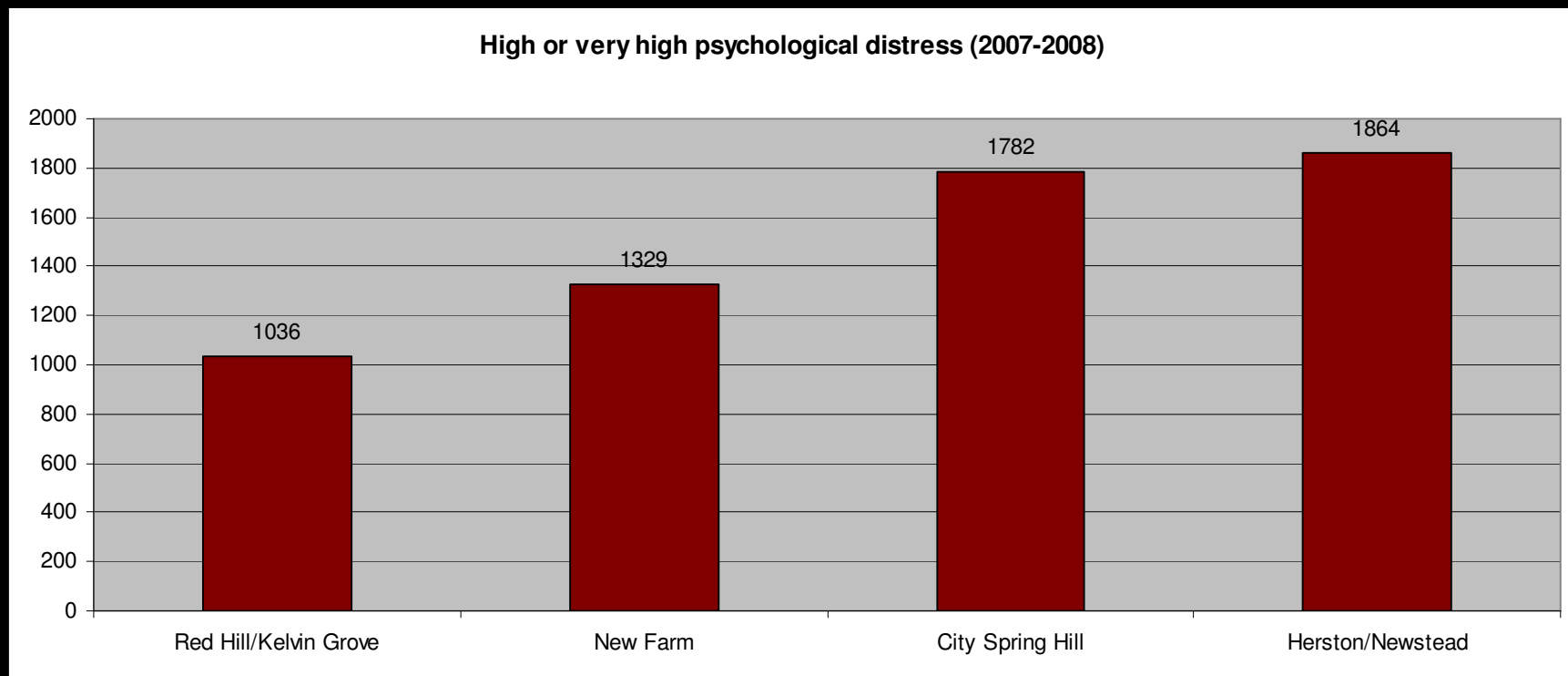
# Provision of assistance to a person with a disability

# High or very high psychological distress 2007/2008

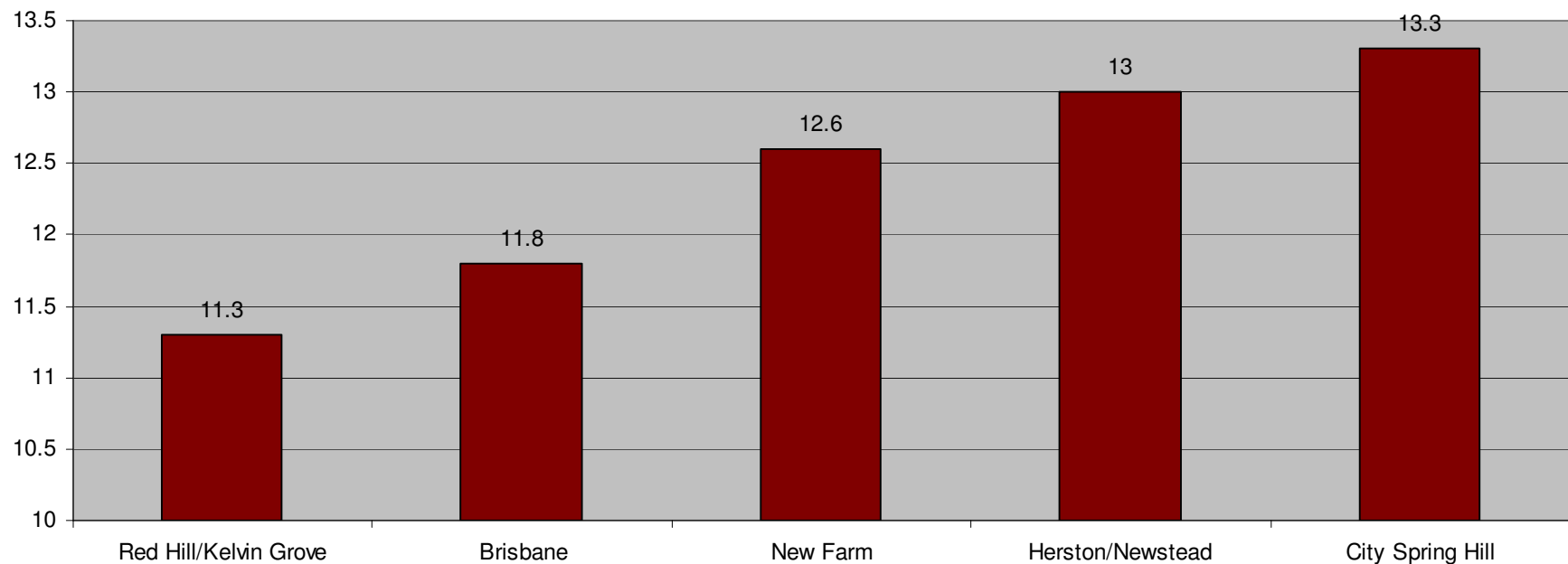

# High or very high psychological distress 2007/2008 (rate / 100)

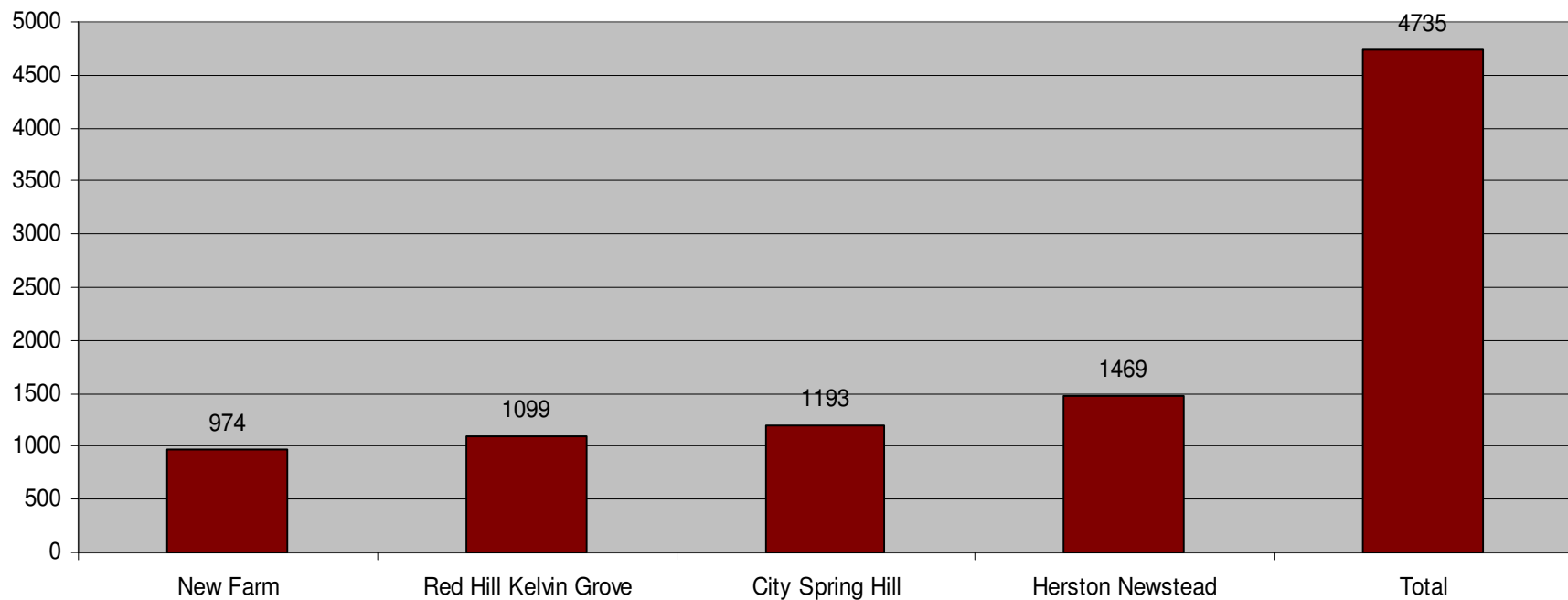
High or very high psychological distress rate per 100

# Mental health care plan

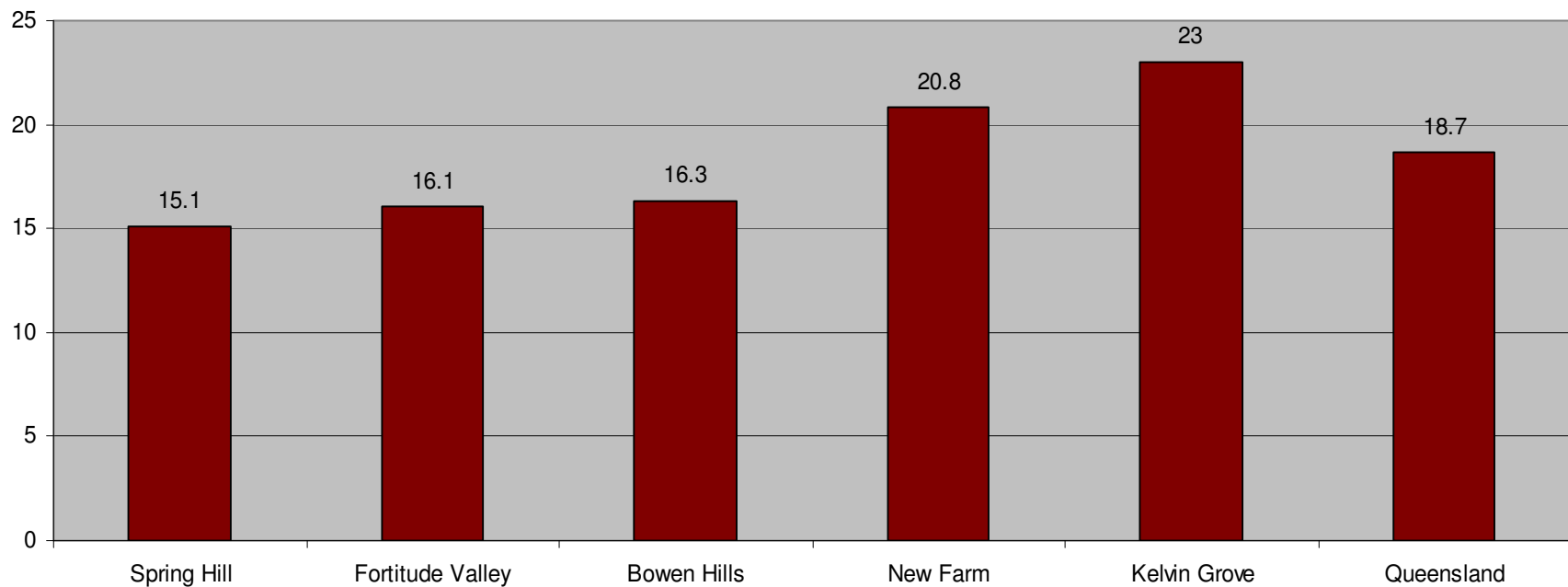
Preparation of a mental health care plan by a GP (2009-2010)

# Indicator of community strength

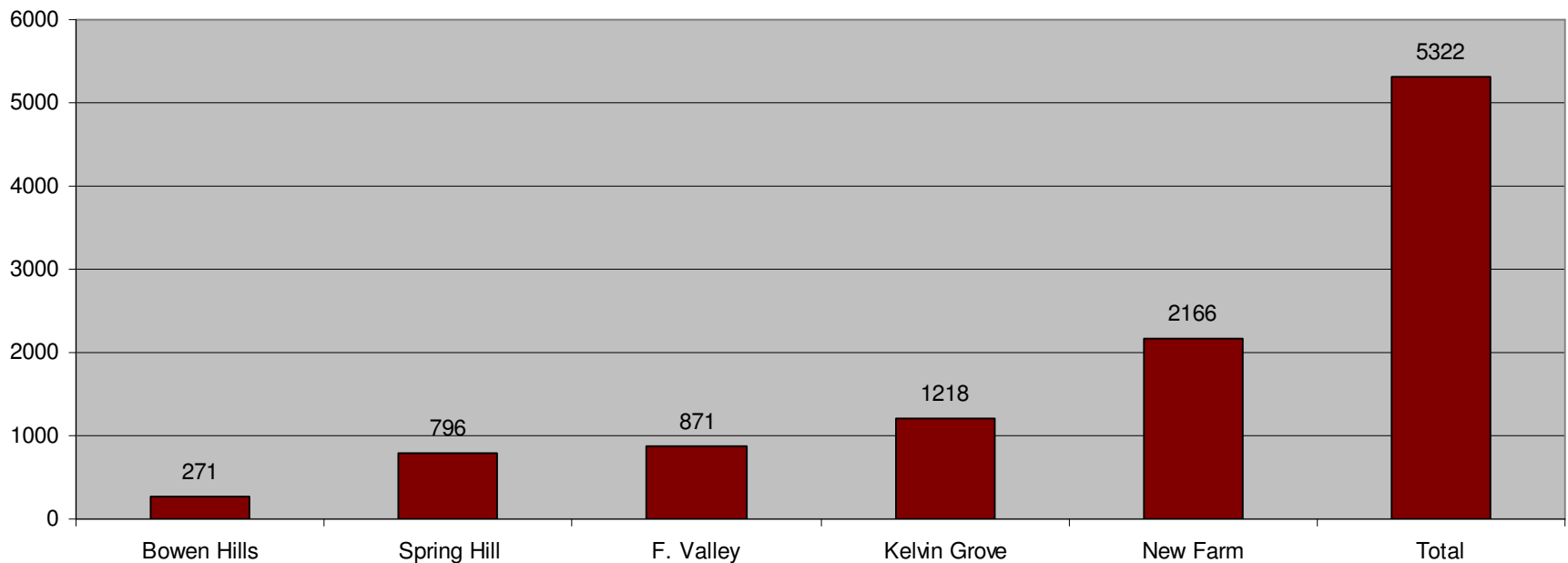
Rates of Volunteering 2011 (%)

Number of people volunteering (2011)

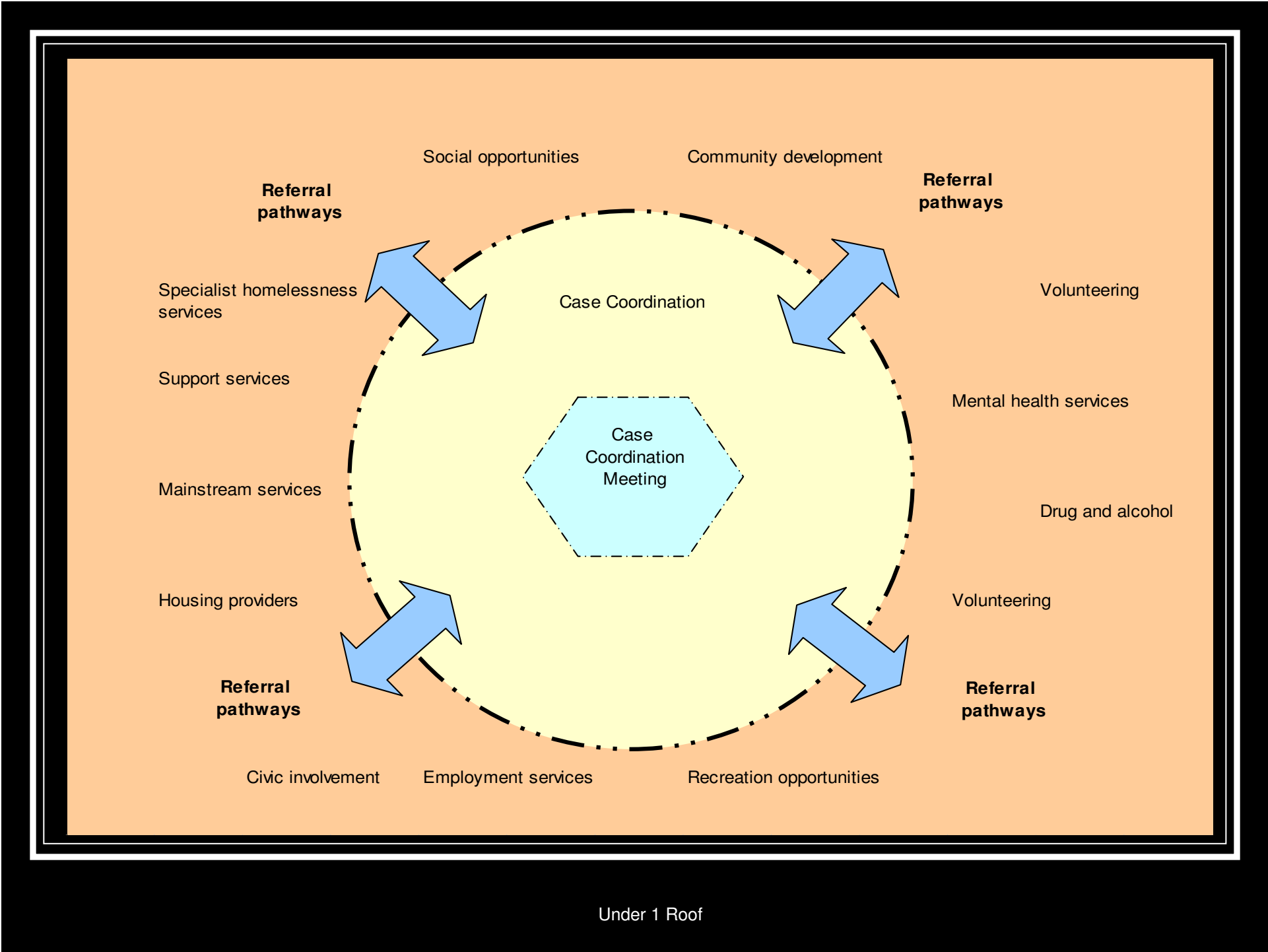

# Under 1 Roof improving client outcomes through case coordination

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- Every two weeks for two hours
- Front line service delivery
- Front line staff
- Agenda: Clients referred whose circumstances are complex and/or who are assessed as potentially benefitting from a coordinated approach (informed consent)
- Housing providers, tenant advice workers and support providers attend (Government and non-government)

# Data notes

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## **Psychological distress (synthetic prediction), 2007-08**

High or very high levels of psychological distress, persons aged 18 years and over  
Compiled by PHIDU using data estimated from the 2007-08 National Health Survey (NHS), ABS (unpublished); and ABS Estimated Resident Population, average of 30 June 2007 and 2008. The data have been derived from the Kessler Psychological Distress Scale-10 items (K-10), which is a scale of non-specific psychological distress based on 10 questions asked of respondents about negative emotional states in the 4 weeks prior to interview. 'High' and 'Very high' distress are the two highest levels of distress categories (of a total of four categories).
