

Under 1 Roof Client Outcomes

Since March 2010, Under 1 Roof has been meeting on a fortnightly basis to work collaboratively with a focus on clients who are assessed as having complex circumstances or where a multi-agency approach would be beneficial. Between 2011 and mid-2014 the following trends and outcomes have been measured.

The number of households referred and exited from Under 1 Roof case coordination over the time period January 2011 and June 2014 are as follows

- ^o The client group has shifted from 43% women to 51.8% women between 2011 and 2014
- In 2011 26% of clients were aged 25 years or less compared to 34.2% in 2014
- 12.3% of clients in 2012-2013 were from a language background other than English. In 2013-2014 it was 18.8%
- o In 2012-2013 14.4% of clients were Indigenous and in 2013-2014, 18% were Indigenous
- 52.2% of clients in 2013-2014 were identified as having a mental health issue compared with 36.6% in 2011
- 32% of clients in 2013-2014 were identified as having a substance use issue compared to 20.4% in 2011
- o 70.8% of clients in 2013-2014 presented with two or more complex issues
- 39.8% of clients in 2013-2014 presented with three or more complex issues.
